IDENTIFICATION OF TWO LARVA[E] LIKELY TO BE CONFUSED WITH COPITARSIA SP.

Copitarsia sp., mature larva.

- 1. With bars on T2 and T3 at the SD1 and SD2 position.
- 2. Without tooth on inside of mandible
- 3. Spiracles are white (ignore the peritreme), esp. of T1 and A8
- 4. Head is reticulate (netted).
- 5. Body above a line through spiracles is peppered with dark spots.
- 6. Labial palp and spin[n]eret as figured. [blunt with indent]
- 7. Body setae white.

Copitarsia sp., small larva. Same as above with following exceptions.

- 1. Head spotted with dark spots.
- 2. Body setae are dark.

Spodoptera exigua (Hubner)

- 1. With bars on T2 and T3 only at the SD2 position.
- 2. Spiracles yellow to light brown (disregard the peritreme).
- 3. Body setae dark.
- 4. Four head setae in a line.
- 5. With dark spot at SD2 position on T2.

Peridroma saucia (Hubner)

- 1. With bars at SD2 position of T2 and T3.
- 2. Spiracles brown to dark brown.
- 3. Head with solid brown areas.
- 4. Spin[n]eret and labial palp as shown.
- 5. Body setae light brown.
